4. The Practice:



- 2. Along the nalla the planting of Jambhul, Vad, Pimpal, Umber trees to be carried out for better utilization of waste water & attraction of birds for their nesting & food.
- 3. Neem is doing well & hence to replace the mortality it is the best option.
- 4. Amaltas, Parijatak, Kashid, Neem, Chinch, Jambhul, Hirava Chafa, Samal, Rain tree, Palas, Peltaforum, Nilgiri are the suitable species to be planted here.
- The scientific water harvesting to be done to catch all the rain water over the ceilings of the buildings through a systematic pipeline to charge the well in the premises from the water conservation point of view.
- 6. Plenty of space is available for solar energy panels, the energy thus generated will be utilized for electrification of campus & extra energy would be supplied to MSEB grid to additional income to the college. As solar energy is pollution free & eco friendly, it will serve the purpose of "Clean India."
- It is noticed that large amount of leaves are available on the ground to convert in to compost fertilizer. For this, necessary machinery to be set to crush the leaves.
- 8. Coconut plants to be administered with Salt crystals.
- Use of Bio fertilizers, green manuring, vermi-compost, Farm yard manure to be implemented in practice.
- Moreover, please seek the technical guidance from the office of the Deputy Conservator of Forests Dhule/ Deputy Director Social Forestry Dhule.

The above mentioned are some of suggestions, based on forestry & silviculture point of views. It is up to the college management how to focus & implement while actual working in day to day practice.
